CARE HOME BAPTISMS

We continue visiting those baptized and teaching the Gospel to those in various rural care homes in Eastern Europe. This week we visited the home where Brother Erik is located, who made huge efforts to get to our meetings despite his cerebral palsy and lack of a wheelchair- see the movie at <http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Hr-vRqLGIU4> .

We're pleased to say that our brother is now in another home where he has better facilities for his situation. We also were pleased to baptize OLGA, ANDREJ, ZIEDONS and RUDA. The advantage of leaving Bibles and *Bible Basics* in these facilities is huge- those who are forgotten in this world, limited physically by strokes and paralysis, often without relatives willing to care for them, are really looking for a relationship with God and Jesus. Many Protestant churches don't bother with such people because they are in no position to pay a tithe, and so they are left with little spiritual attention and certainly no chance to be taught God's word. Please continue praying for these brothers and sisters and other contacts.

NEWBORN BABY

We previously appealed for your prayers for a sister in a night shelter who has had a baby. As you can't have babies in the night shelters, and must be out by 8 a.m. and only back in by 8 p.m. every day, receiving state support of around 10 Euros / month, the usual procedure is for such children to be taken over by the state, kept in orphanages with very automated care and possibly given out for adoption later. We have really tried to help our sister by all means so that this isn't the case for her. She's temporarily in a crisis center with the baby. We've provided a pram and other things and are doing our best to keep our sister positive. Here you can see her being visited by Cindy, being given photos we took and developed of her and the baby etc.

The crisis center is a sad affair- split into two sections, for unaccompanied children (i.e. abandoned- many women really cannot cope with such pressure and abandon babies in all kinds of places), and children with mothers:

This is a sad world and yet without doubt we are entering into it with the good news of Christ and it is being responded to.

THIS COMING WEEK, God willing- There will be a lot of travel being done in order for contacts to be baptized into the Lord Jesus, please pray for all in their journeys, and for the Lord's continued work in the lives of so many.
