

## Germany and Western Europe February 2005

We have many contacts throughout Western Europe, and in recent times, a number of them have been visited. There was the baptism of Marcus in Belgium reported recently, and now we're pleased to report the baptism of DOMINIK in Berlin. Dominik has an excellent knowledge of the true Gospel. He's worked through it all doctrine by doctrine. Whilst in training to be a Pentecostal pastor, Dominik realized that the trinity is not taught in the Bible. He was expelled from the church and is now alone. He once spoke in tongues, but now feels this was fraudulent. He's a wonderful and very focused person whom surely the Lord will use further. His wife is very much with him and hopes soon to be baptized, Lord willing. They once had a house group meeting at their place- hence the very large table and many chairs in their small flat [pictured below]. Their hope is that some day soon they'll be able to fill the home again with those who love the Lord in truth. One interesting thing that Dominik shared was about the large number of evangelical and Pentecostal Christians in Germany and Austria who have rejected the trinity in the last 5 years, leaving many of them with no church to belong to. Websites run by these people like [www.bibelcenter.de](http://www.bibelcenter.de) reveal a large degree of similarity with Christadelphian teaching, although of course issues like the devil remain major barriers. It's our hope and prayer that we might be able to gather some of these folks together into a strong and dynamic ecclesia. After the baptism we held a breaking of bread, and it was a great sign of our fellowship for Dominik to receive welcoming phone calls straight away, minutes after his immersion! It was great that brother Marcus could call from Belgium, having been baptized just 2 weeks ago and similarly greeted by mobile phone calls just after his baptism. Berlin is very far away from the German Christadelphian centre in Esslingen, but Dominik is very open to contact with any brethren passing through Berlin. We've developed an online breaking of bread service in order to help brothers like Dominik and Marcus to have fellowship more widely. If any others in isolation would like to join in, please contact us.

We're planning on translating the Bible Basics colour leaflets into German- any who know German and are able to assist, please do contact us.
