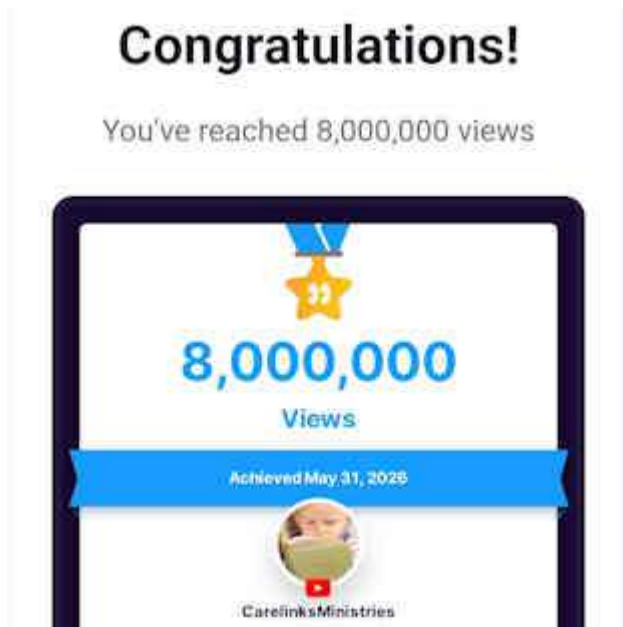


June 2026 Ukraine, UK, mobility scooter

We have several YouTube channels, and our main one, Carelinks Ministries, this month reached 8 million views. This is a huge impact on society worldwide, although most of the views are from the UK and Europe. We thank the Lord for so working with us.



UKRAINE

More than 41,000 people - including almost 4,500 children - sheltered underground in the Kiev metro one night this week, a record number. The bombardment has been heavier than ever in the war. So many of our brothers and sisters are affected. You go down the shelter and emerge to find pavements and walkways peppered with grenade hits, designed to cause as much damage as possible to as many people as possible:



So do continue your prayers. We hope to get there to help some of our sisters next month, Lord willing, and meet some more Jewish contacts interested in baptism.

We have a sister in Ukraine in need of a mobility scooter. It's not easy to get them in Ukraine at this time, brand new ones are hugely expensive, and it's hard to know the quality of second hand ones. They're the kind of thing folks buy and no longer use... if anyone can get their hands on

one, please let us know. Bear in mind that for transport on a plane, " They generally cannot exceed a limit of 300 Wh (or two batteries at 160 Wh each)".

UK

This week we went up to Cambridgeshire to meet and baptize yet another user of the Bible Companion app, VICTOR. He has carefully gone through much of the material on the app and uses it for his daily devotionals. He found the teaching and approach quite different to that of the Pentecostal church he had been attending, and found answers to many nagging questions and doubts. Such a joy to meet another young man who has worked things out slowly and seriously, and who realizes that despite all the pressures of career and young family and a new house... it really is only our relationship with God that matters.



Our meetings in Croydon continue with great blessing. Brother Sean, shaking with Parkinson's, was in a terrible position, living in his late mother's house, which a family member has claimed, got in their name and evicted him from. He has remained living there as long as possible but has to leave- and he had nowhere to go. He has been on the Council's housing waiting list for a very long time but with apparently no progress. Right after his baptism, he was told by the Council that they had found him a property. It's a brand new, Council owned flat. This week, he got the keys to it. And we have begun helping him move into it, although it's unfurnished. If anyone has a car and could spare some time in Croydon, they can join us ferrying his stuff. He's packed up as much as he can into suitcases and here's Cindy and Evia helping him with packing up:





Moving home at his age and in his condition is a huge challenge. His zeal for the Lord after baptism is so wonderful to behold.
